- I. Opening Business: Meeting called to order at 4:30.
  - a. Agenda Approval- motion to approve agenda was made by Simmons and seconded by Franklin
  - b. Approval of minutes- motion to approve minutes was made by Jones and seconded by Hash
  - c. Good News- Kaylee Worrall and Rhiannon Jones made it to the All-state choir
  - d. Lisa James, Vision 2021- Shared the new accountability model, different categories are weighted differently. For CCMS it is as follows: achievement- 28%; gap- 28%; growth- 28%; college and career readiness- 16%. The new standards are more rigorous and will require more PD to implement effectively. Some teachers have been sent to Denver to PEBC to learn strategies that encourage higher level thinking in students.
  
- II. Student achievement-
  - a. Assessing student achievement- 5/10 No Child Left Behind targets were met, 0 goals were met for reading. Goals for CCMS in reading were 79.6 and 68.68 in Math. Actual reading was 71.84 and Math was 64.08. This is corrective action year 1 at CCMS. We are seeing differences in male and female scores again so we are looking at ways to reduce the gap. Our students are doing poorly on multiple choice items. For on-demand, we had only 29.6 students who scored proficient/distinguished. There was a huge gap in male vs. female.
  - b. Student achievement report- Interventions include reciprocal teaching, LEA and scrimmages for on-demand. Students are grouped according to their RIT score from MAP. There are also 6 Math teachers performing interventions in Math.
  
- III. Planning-
  - a. Program reviews- We have a toolkit from KASC that breaks down what we should be doing each month. Jones reported that the middle school worked with the high school at PD this summer on the program review. There is an online folder of lesson plans and student work. Reviewers have to see

evidence of what we have done. Mr. Hash reported that the inclusion of all students has proved to be most challenging.

- a) PBIS- There is a bulletin board up in the front hallway to recognize all PAWS award recipients so far this year. Three award recipients are drawn each Monday morning and called to the office to receive a prize. Students with 0 referrals were rewarded with popsicles at lunch. The next behavior reward is scheduled for October 31<sup>st</sup> and will be popcorn and drinks.
- b) LA and Math- Language Arts and Math teachers are coming back to share what they are learning about the new standards. Language Arts teachers are working on creating modules.
