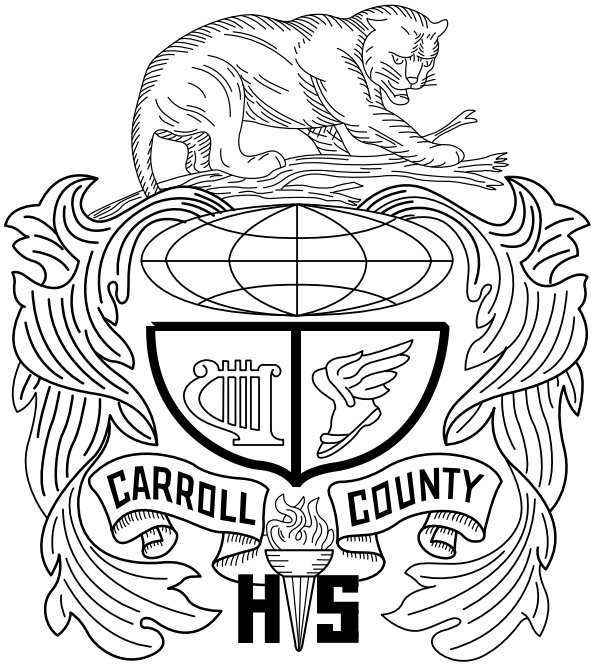

months.

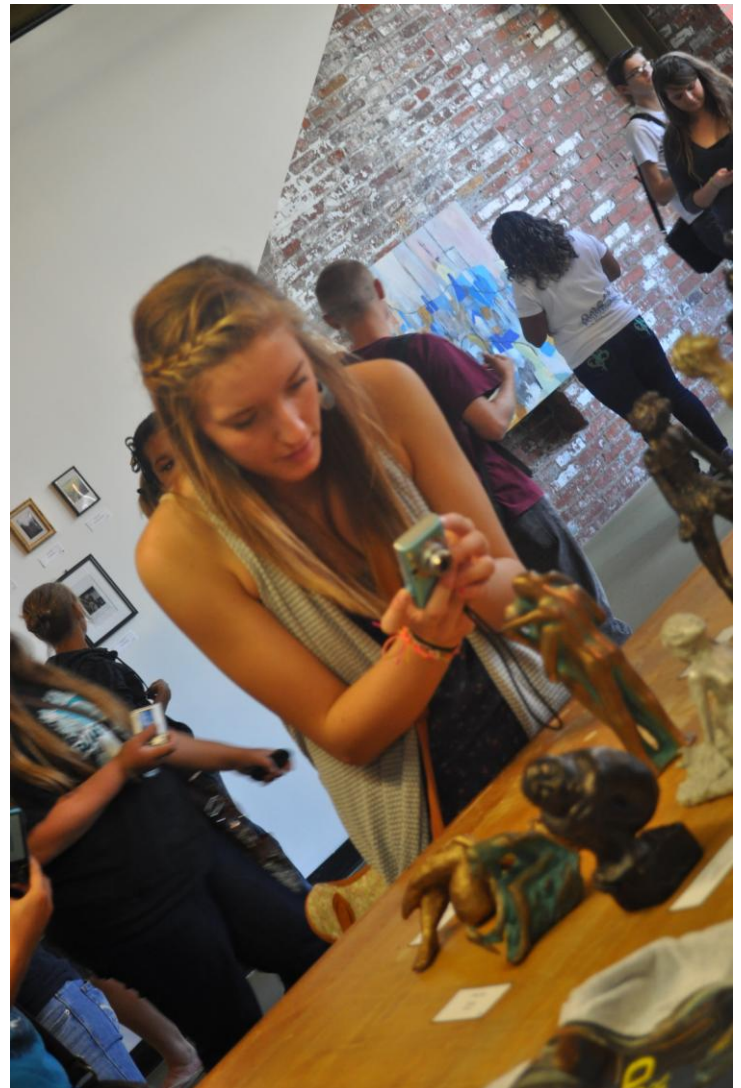
The CCHS Choir has been wo

Academic Achievement

- The state assessment for the PLAN test and the SR. On Demand writing assessment will take place on September 20th. Our teachers are preparing our students for this assessment by using ACT like questions throughout their class. Senior English teachers are modeling proficient responses and practicing the old On Demand questions.
- We have ordered the Freshman Plan Test to administer as well. The results of the Freshman Plan Test should be back in two to three weeks.
- The Juniors will be taking a common ACT Science Test. The tests will be scored by an online program provided to all juniors. It is called E-Prep. From the results, specific lessons will be provided to the students to prepare them for the real ACT.
- E-Prep was purchased for all Jrs and Sophs at CCHS.
